

## Area Walking and Jogging Routes

### York Harbor Loop 3.5 miles

At the top of the driveway, take a right onto Route 1A North. Follow Route 1A through York Harbor with views out to the sea. After passing the Trinity Church, take a left onto Woodbridge Road. Follow Woodbridge to the end, then take a left. This will lead you into the center of York Village. At the monument, bear to the left on Route 1A North. Stage Neck Inn is approximately 1 mile on the right.

### Fisherman's Walk 3.0 miles

Cross the grass of Edwards' Harborside Inn until you reach the cement pathway. This pathway will lead you along the York Harbor. Go up over Route 103; the path continues on the other side. You will cross the "Wiggly Bridge" (be sure to wiggle the rails). Continue straight through Steedman Woods, coming out at Lindsey Road. Make a right onto Lindsey Road, walking past some of York's most historic properties. Take a right onto Route 1A North and continue for about 1 mile to Stage Neck Inn, on your right.

### York River Walk 5.5 miles

At the top of the driveway take a left, following Route 1A South until you reach Route 103. Follow Route 103 for about 1 mile. Turn right onto Seabury Road. This will be a hilly route along the south side of the York River. After about 2.7 miles, turn right and cross the York River on Sewall's Bridge. Turn right at the end of the Bridge, onto Lindsey Road which passes historic Hancock Wharf and York Village. When you reach Route 1A, make a right, and follow Route 1A North until you return to Stage Neck Inn.

### Waterview Loop 3.7 miles

Fisherman's Walk across the Wiggly Bridge, to Steedman Woods, to left onto Lindsey Road. Left onto Sewall's Bridge to York River Walk (Seabury Road), to Route 103, back to SNI via Fisherman's Walk.

While in the area, please explore these other attractions ...

### Historic York

"Agamenticus" was the Native American name given to one of the earliest New England settlements now known as York. The town was incorporated as America's first chartered city in 1632. Old York Historical Society has preserved much of the history in seven museum buildings, including the country's oldest jail (Old Gaol on your map).

### Cape Neddick Light

York's famous lighthouse is the beloved Cape Neddick Light station (popularly known as "Nubble Light"), built in 1879 on a small rocky island known as a nubble. With its brightly contrasting colors and beautiful rocky shoreline, Nubble Light attracts many visitors each year, particularly photographers. With thunderous waves, crashing surf, and plumes of ocean spray towering over the island, the Nubble is a spectacular scene during storms. The best view of the lighthouse is from Sohier Park, which includes a visitors' center and gift shop.

### Beaches

York offers many spectacular beaches: **Harbor Beach** adjacent to the Inn combines a sheltered beach and the rocky shoreline; **Long Sands Beach** offers over 1½ miles of sandy beach with parking and a bathhouse; **Short Sands Beach** offers a bathhouse, playground, basketball courts and parking adjacent to many shops and restaurants; **Passaconaway Beach** in Cape Neddick offers the ultimate exploration at low tide with a sand bar and many tidal pools.

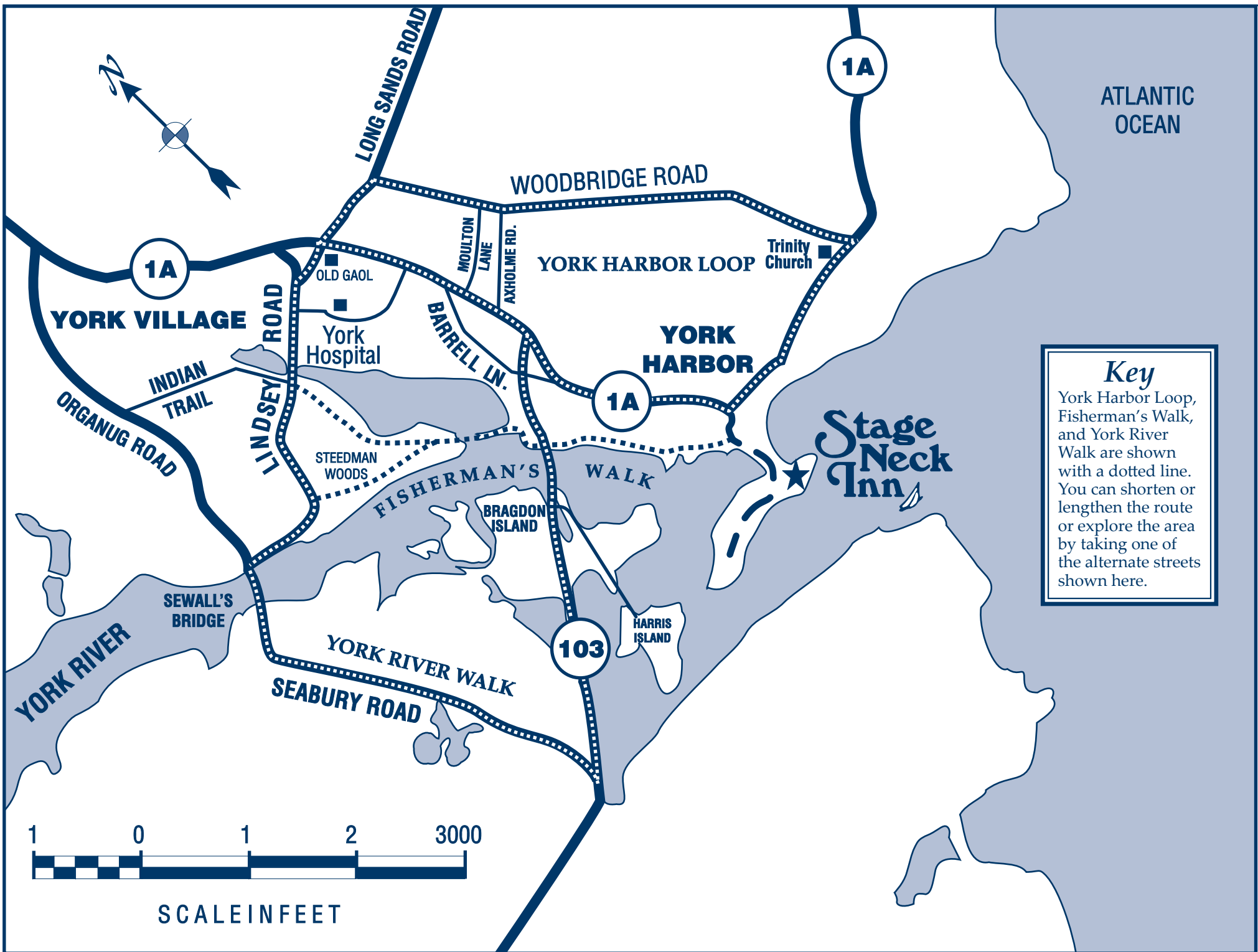
